A Message from The School Council and Eco Council

Dear Parents and Carers,

As the school council and eco council at the school, we take our responsibility as role models very seriously. We love our school community, and we want to ensure that everyone is safe and that we are all doing our bit to reduce our carbon footprint. Because of this, we are writing to you today with the aim of reducing congestion outside our school during pick-up and school drop-off times and making our community a safer place.

This has been an ongoing project for us and we have already been working hard with the local PCSO who has previously visited us for a road safety assembly and has helped us with morning patrols to ensure everyone's safety.

Our kind request to parents/carers:

- *Please walk, cycle or scoot to school (if you are able).*
- *Please drive slowly and carefully near the school and never exceed the speed limit.*
- *Keep yours and your children's seatbelts on.*
- *Respect the road markings and keep the zig-zag lines clear.*
- *Avoid parking across driveways.*
- *Be kind and let others pass where you can.*
- *Turn cars around at appropriate spaces and not in driveways, being observant of pedestrians.*

We also want to start a 'Park and Stride'. We feel this is an excellent solution that will help prevent traffic and possible accidents.

Instead of trying to drive all the way to the school entrance, you park a short distance away—perhaps a five- or ten-minute walk—and walk the remaining distance with your children. This brings some wonderful benefits:

- *Fewer cars outside the school gates means a much safer, calmer environment for everyone crossing.*
- *Fewer cars means our air will be cleaner*
- *A short walk in the morning wakes up our brains and gets us active, meaning we arrive in class focused and ready to learn.*
- *You won't have to battle for a parking space right at the gates*

We want our school to remain a happy, healthy, and safe environment where everyone is looked after. By making a small change, you are actively protecting us and helping us set a brilliant example for the younger year groups. We will be conducting surveys over the rest of Summer Term to see the impact of this and the class with the most 'park and striders' or walkers/cyclists/scooters will be rewarded with an extra play-time before the summer holidays.

Thank you so much for taking the time to read our letter, and for helping us to keep our school community safe for every pupil.
