## Week beginning 24<sup>th</sup> September

Last week was rather blustery, but the children still enjoyed exploring the Eco-Garden! We went on a colour hunt in the garden and many children enjoyed watering the plants. The children have also been exploring their hands by singing finger rhymes, using different parts of their hands in dough gym and choosing their favourite colours when creating hand prints. At the end of the week another new friend, Harrison joined our class.

This week we welcome three new friends to the class – Oliver, Maia and Shanna – we hope that they too enjoy exploring the resources at Nursery!

We will continue to follow the 'Jolly Phonics' programme, and this week we will be focusing on the 'A' phoneme. As mentioned last week, we discuss the letter sound rather than the letter name, e.g. arm, ant, antelope, apple and so NOT acorn, ape, ace etc.

Our mathematics activities this week will include finding and naming 2D shapes. We will encourage the children to make patterns and pictures with 2D shapes. We will also set up shapes for sponge printing and to make impressions in the salt dough so that the children can get creative.
