Week beginning 5th November

We will begin the week talking about and creating images of fireworks with paint. To link with the main school, we will then be thinking about Diwali on Tuesday and Wednesday. We will set up opportunities for the children to create Rangoli patterns with coloured rice and chalk, produce swirling patterns on hand/arm outlines, make/taste barfi sweets (ingredients: milk powder, condensed milk, double cream and dessicated coconut – please let us know if your child has any allergies) and we will encourage them to have a go at a simple Diwali dance. At the end of the week we will talk about Remembrance Sunday and provide resources for the children to create poppy pictures.

There is one more job to complete on the windows, therefore, on Thursday, we ask you to drop off AND pick up your children from the KS1 gate (next to the Village Hall) as we will be having the Nursery session in the DT room on this day. We hope to be back in the Nursery as usual on Friday – but will let you know if the window fitters need more time.

We will continue to follow the 'Jolly Phonics' programme, and this week we will be focusing on the 'C/K' phoneme. Since we discuss the sound of the letters – c and k make the same sound and so the children can bring items beginning with c and/or k this week.

We like to take the children outside to play on rainy days – in fact many had great fun with the animal umbrellas last week! Therefore, please ensure that your child brings a pair of wellies (named please!) to the Nursery on wet days.
