Where learning has no limits

Week beginning 14th January

The children really enjoyed listening to the Shopping Basket story last week – many remembered which animal came next in the story and which item of food each animal wanted to take. The children have started creating and painting their own baskets, and this week, we will think about which food items they would like to put into them. To help them think about this, we will be looking at, feeling and tasting different fruit. We will include fruit from the story and a few others (orange, bananas, apples, pineapple, grapes and blueberries – please let us know if your child has any allergies).

This week our Mathematics activities will include making marks to represent numbers. We will continue to focus on counting objects and then have a go at making marks to show how many objects that we see. We will also be looking at numbers on shopping lists and having a go at creating our own.

We will continue following the 'Jolly Phonics' programme, and this week we will be thinking about the 'O' phoneme. Each week, the children are more than welcome to bring items to the Nursery beginning with the 'phoneme of the week'. We think about the sound the letter makes (such as orange, octopus, or olive) and so not owl.

Helping your child at home

When shopping, the children could look out for different fruit and vegetables – they could talk about their colour, shape or texture. Perhaps they could even try a new fruit or vegetable, we would love to hear about their experiences!
