Week beginning 4th February

The children enjoyed listening to the story of the tortoise and the hare last week and in groups we thought about how the animals might be feeling during the race and at the end of the race. The children also found out about some of the differences between a hare and a rabbit.

Towards the end of the week we set up a Chinese Restaurant in the role play area. The children have started 'taking orders', 'cooking' and 'serving' their dishes and will continue to develop these skills this week!

This week we will be thinking about the Chinese New year; we will be finding out about some of their traditions, moving in different ways to create a dragon dance and listening to a story about Nian.

Our Mathematics activities will include sorting small collections of Nursery toys. As well as suggesting ways for the children to sort the toys, we will be encouraging the children to also use their own ideas.

We will continue following the 'Jolly Phonics' programme, and this week we will be thinking about the 'F' phoneme. Each week, the children are more than welcome to bring items to the Nursery beginning with the 'phoneme of the week'.
