Welcome back! We hope you all enjoyed the half term holiday.

Before the holiday we noticed that some children were having fun playing with puppets whilst others were enjoying making different sounds with percussion instruments. We have therefore decided to set up a theatre stage in the role play area. We will include resources such as puppets, instruments, and dressing up clothes so that the children can 'perform' using their own ideas. We hope that it will encourage the children's creative and imaginative play.

On Wednesday we hope to visit the Eco Garden and also go onto the main school field. We will be looking out for flowers/buds/leaves that are beginning to grow. We will also be collecting natural materials to create our own bug hotels back at Nursery.

We will continue following the 'Jolly Phonics' programme, and this week we will be thinking about the 'J' phoneme. Each week, the children are more than welcome to bring items to the Nursery beginning with the 'phoneme of the week'.
