Week beginning 11th March

Thank you so much for supporting our Book Day – it was so nice to see such a variety of animals. All the children had an opportunity to talk about their animal character on the 'theatre stage'. We also joined all the children in the main school hall for a Book day assembly and, before walking back to the Nursery, we had a 'story telling' session with the Reception class.



We have started creating a class book linked to the 'Dear Zoo' story and this week we will be completing the book by encouraging the children to draw unusual pets. When we are thinking about these animals, we will encourage the children to count different aspects e.g. legs, wings, eyes or tails and also encourage the children to make marks to represent numbers.

We will continue following the 'Jolly Phonics' programme, and this week we will be thinking about the 'W' phoneme. Each week, the children are more than welcome to bring items to the Nursery beginning with the 'phoneme of the week'.

On Thursday we will be going to the main school field and the Eco-garden. We hope to collect natural materials such as fallen leaves and twigs to that each child can set up their own bug hotel. We plan to leave their 'hotels' in the Eco-garden and then re-visit them from time to time in the Spring and Summer.

Helping your child at home

Perhaps you and your child could draw another animal at home. If they do it on paper, they are more than welcome to bring it to the Nursery to show us, but they could also try on other surfaces e.g. floor chalks on a patio. It would be great if you could encourage your child to form lines, circles, zig-zags and wavy lines.
