Maths	<p>This week we will continue to work on angles and lines. The children will be learning to:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify a right angle; recognise it as a quarter turn of a circle. Compare right angles with other angles, greater and smaller. Begin to recognise pairs of lines when parallel and perpendicular. <p><i>Maths homework this week will be sent out on Thursday as there is no school on Friday. It should be returned the following Thursday.</i></p>
